Some students have trouble adjusting to school life and learning; other students may be dealing with issues such as absenteeism, bullying, drug use or depression.

Lyndale Secondary College seeks to put student's wellbeing first. We have access to student welfare staff who can work closely with students guiding them through problems or difficulties they are having. Welfare staff also works with principals and teachers to develop and maintain a safe and supportive school environment.

We also have access to a range of student support services which include: guidance officers and psychologists, social workers, visiting teachers (for visually, hearing and physically impaired students), speech pathologists and curriculum consultants.

SENIOR SCHOOL NEWS

Unit 3 results

The first round of results for certain Unit 3 studies including all the Sciences, Accounting and Studio Arts, were made available on Monday, 3rd August. These results are the strongest indicator to students about their progress in terms of final achievement levels. This is an important time for feedback since it

allows students time to reflect on their progress in relation to their study program and to discuss this with their teachers. With final exams commencing on the 30th October, which is just over 6 weeks of classes, it is vital that every opportunity is used to optimise learning.

In the next few weeks, Year 12 students will be making important decisions concerning tertiary courses they would like to apply for. Applications close at 5pm on Wednesday, 30th September. All students are encouraged to submit an application.

VCE examination revision programme

In just **9 weeks**, students will commence their **end of year examinations**. These final examinations are undoubtedly the **most important** of all VCE assessments as they have the **biggest impact** in determining each student's final **ENTER** score. The manner in which students approach their studies and how well they perform across the next few months will play a major role in determining which tertiary course they are accepted into, and hence their future career paths.

In order to secure the **highest possible VCE marks**, students need to commit to a **consistent** and comprehensive **study effort** between now and the end of year examinations.

There are a number of revision classes and lectures available for students to be involved in – please check the noticeboard in the Study Centre or see Mrs Simadri for more information on dates, times and costs.

Course Counselling

Students in Years 9, 10 and 11 have had their Course Counselling interviews in the last couple of weeks; subject selections for 2010 were due in by the **26th August for all students**. All students should have a Prospectus CD 2010 and be able to check details of Unit 1/2 or 3/4 studies offered at the College. **Please note that this information is also available on the College intranet**. Any student requiring further assistance with selecting their subjects/courses must see Mr Palatsides, the Careers Coordinator, or

other members of the Course Counselling Team.

Year 9 students wishing to accelerate next year were required to complete a subject selection form and obtain endorsement from a relevant teacher to support their application. An interview will be organised with students who gain approval to participate in the acceleration program once the applications have been sorted by the Year 9 Coordinators.

Enrol to Vote

All students in Years 11 and 12 must ensure that they have enrolled to vote (regardless of whether or not they are 18 yrs old) by completing the forms made available by the Australian Electoral Commission. Most students will have received these forms via mail to their home address; forms are also available from the sub-school office.

Yr 12 Jumpers

Much to the excitement of Year 12 students, the rugby jumpers ordered at the end of Term 2 finally arrived at the College on Friday 21st August! They were distributed to students who had paid and were present at lunchtime; there are some students who must pay \$70 at the Bursar's Office prior to collecting their jumper from the sub-school.

The jumper looks very smart and maintains the predominant navy blue colour of the senior school.

Uniform

All students are expected to be in full school uniform every day, and are encouraged to wear a white skivvy under the school t-shirt. Please note that students wearing white long sleeve t-shirts under the school t-shirt, and without a school jumper, will be considered to be out of uniform.

A reminder that **'hoodies' are not acceptable**. Consequences, which may include students being **sent home**, will be considered for those students who regularly sport hoodies.

A reminder that all students are required to bring a note from home if they are not in full

uniform, and are expected to collect a uniform pass from the Coordinators' Office at the start of the day; **after the third pass, senior students will be sent home if they attend school in incorrect attire.**

VCAL 2010

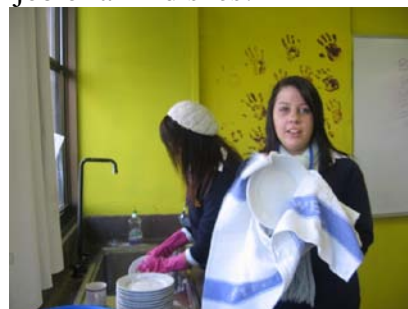
